ICE OUT 4/17/15

With the extremely cold winter and 30 inches of ice on the lake, it was surprising that the Ice Out occurred this early. However, it didn't top 2010's ice out date of April 5th. On April 16th it appeared it was gone, but a call to Candy Dailey on the North End proved wrong. The wind had pushed ice slush to the North End, but by the next day it was gone. Therefore with Candy's input, the 17th was the official date for Ice Out.

EURASIAN WATER MILFOIL (EWM) STATUS & GRANT APPLICATION

The 2014 Fall Survey identified EWM growth and a proposed control strategy was to perform Herbicide treatment of 77.6 acres of EWM. With the assistance of the association consultant, Onterra LLC., a grant application was filed with the DNR on Feb. 1st, 2015.

The total Grant Award Project cost was \$121,381.95 with the state contributing 65% (\$78,898.27) of the total cost and Lake Metonga's share of the cost is \$42,483.68.

The DNR would not provide any herbicide treatment funds in 2015, but would apply the funding for 2016.

Considering critical EWM growth areas, the Association Board decided 21.6 acres should be treated and would be at the Association's expense. The map points out the critical EWM beds selected. This was proposed to the DNR and it was accepted.

1) Bed B-15: This bed fronts the city swimming beach frontage and could become a hazard to swimmers.

2) Bed A-15: Directly out in front of the North Boat Launch area. Boats running through would cause fragmentation & spreading.

3) Bed F-15: This bed is encroaching toward the South County Park swimming beach area and could be a hazard to swimmers.

4) Bed G-15: Directly fronts the South Boat Launch area. Boats running through would cause fragmentation & spreading.



The Herbicide Application Cost to treat 21.6 acres is \$21,860.08 and would be preformed by Clean Lakes and Onterra must perform pre & post treatment surveys plus submit the results including the effectiveness of the treatment to the DNR. This adds an additional cost of \$7,746.50 to the 2015 treatment costs. Total = \$21,860.08 + \$7,340.00 =\$29,200.08.

All Riparian owners who front the treatment areas were sent packets, in accordance with WI. DNR State Statue NR 107.04(4), that included: Permit Application, Treatment Map, Article published in the local Newspaper and Fact Sheets of the 2, 4-D and Endothall Herbicide used in the treatment.

BULLHEAD HARVEST

An aggressive harvest in previous years has significantly reduced an abundant bullhead population. As a result, the Perch population has increased considerably. The Walleye 18" size limit, natural reproduction and the bullhead harvest have increased the lakes walleye population. Mike Preul, Fishery Biologist at Mole Lake proposed to harvest again in 2015. About 900 were harvested out of Peterson's Bay on 5/7/15. They were stored in holding pens and are given away free to the public on 5/15/15. Further electro-shocking harvest will be preformed by Mike and his staff.

Mike's Request to all boaters and people on shore: Take a small mesh net with you and if you see schools of baby bullheads, net them, take them to the shore and dispose of them in the trash.

TRIBAL HARVEST

As soon as Ice Out occurred, the Mole Lake Tribe speared. A total of 681 was speared; nearly 400 less than what was speared in 2014.

CLEAN BOATS-CLEAN WATERS BOAT INSPECTORS

Lake Metonga Association is planning to monitor and inspect boats, trailers and other recreational equipment that <u>enter</u> and <u>leave</u> the boat launches at the North and South end of the Lake.

If Lake Users fail to clean their boats and equipment, invasive species can easily enter Metonga. Since Lake Metonga has Eurasian Water Milfoil and Zebra Mussels, it is equally important to inspect and clean boats and equipment leaving the Lake to prevent their spread to other water bodies.

A \$7,971.00 Grant was received from the WDNR to financially support hiring three inspectors to cover the boat launches at the North and South end of the lake. The State will fund 75% (\$5,978.25) of the total budgeted cost. Two inspectors are high school Senior's, Jason Smith, Deven Groff will fill the programmed schedule which begins on May 23rd and continues through September 8th. An inspector training session was conducted by WDNR staff at the Crandon Public Library.

We desperately need someone to step forward to manage this valuable program. Les is unable to continue managing this effect.

Walleyes and Evasive Species

New Name, New Format, New Goal. The Lake Metonga Walleye Banquet has generated enough cash to transform our walleye population from .6 mature Walleye per acre to 4.9 mature Walleye per acre. We are now considered a "Premier Walleye Lake".

During this transformation we were able to fund the cost to contain our Eurasian Water Milfoil EWM infestation to about eighty acres. The DNR Eradication Program changed in 2014-2015 and limited treatment to under 30 acres per year. The last Lake Survey measured acreage at over 117 acres. The DNR will join us again in 2016 for a more comprehensive treatment plan, which of course will cost us a bundle.

By mid-July, you will understand why we are starting our Fund Raising early. Thus the new name and format!

We have a great start with over \$10,000 in fabulous prizes. Our Local Lake Friends and Venders are promising another \$10,000 "IN KIND" Services. We have a start on 20 Great Baskets which could use some enhancement to maximize their potential.
