


A GREAT SUCCESS STORY

The Association partnered with Sokaogon Chippewa Community at Mole Lake, under the supervision of Fishery Biologist Mike Preul to harvest an over-abundance of bullheads that thrive in Metonga's waters. Mike and his staff initially set fyke nets; however, the bullheads weren't moving into the shallow water so very few were captured in the nets. The decision was made to do electro-shocking.

The harvesting project to reduce the population of bullheads in Lake Metonga has successfully removed over 3 tons (6,924 pounds) of bullheads. At an average weight of 1 pound per fish, approximately 6,295 bullheads have been removed and distributed to organizations and individuals since May 6th.

The captured fish were placed in holding nets. The Raptors Education Group, Inc. of Antigo, Wisconsin received 2,810 pounds of bullheads during the last two weeks in May. This group rehabilitates injured eagles, owls, other birds and animals so they can be returned to the wild. Mole Lake Tribal members received 1,320 pounds.

During the first week of June, Lake Metonga Association members and other volunteers utilized Jay Schaefer's deer processing building to fillet bullheads for New-Cap, Crandon's food pantry. Over 200 pounds of fillets were packaged and given to the food pantry.

An ad was placed in the local newspapers inviting area residents to participate in the free bullhead give-away. In about 1-1/2 hours, 1,339 pounds were distributed.


What's Next? Mike will continue to electro-shock in the next two weeks in hopes of raising the total to 10,000 pounds of bullheads. He needs assistance in netting bullheads on the electro-shocking boat. Please call him at 715-478-7621 and offer assistance. This has been a tremendous project. Everyone benefits. Special thanks to Mike for all his effort and to the Mole Lake Tribal Council for their support.

FISH ALERT If you are fishing from a boat or dock and you catch a bullhead, don't throw it back into the water. Dispose of it in the trash or bury it on land. Also, if you see schools of young bullheads, try to net as many as possible and also discard by burying them. **Let's all help to reduce the population!**

SCUBA DIVERS As a part of our Aquatic Invasive Species Control & Prevention Grant project, 49.9 acres of Eurasian Water Milfoil ("EWM") will be chemically treated in June 2008. There is one milfoil bed (0.3 acres) on the north end of the Lake where a small colony of EWM plants are too scattered to warrant chemical treatment. We need scuba divers to volunteer to hand remove this small patch. This is an experimental procedure in the Grant Project requirements to be fulfilled by our Association. Please call Les Schramm at 715-478-5197 to volunteer. It would be beneficial to have more than one diver. A map and instructions will be available for this project in June.

OUR BOAT PARADE IS SCHEDULED FOR SATURDAY, JULY 5, 2008 STARTING TIME IS 4:00 P.M.



Display the numbered card you've been assigned as you pass the Judges Stand. <u>Please parade close to shore</u> so that the judges and people around the Lake can fully appreciate your designs.
- 3. The parade route will end at Mallard's on Metonga. Prizes will be awarded to the top three entries: 1st place \$50.00; 2nd place \$30.00; and 3rd place \$20.00. A cookout will follow the parade. All Association members are welcome at the cookout even though you did not participate in the parade. Non-members are welcome to join in the fun.
