FISHERIES & HABITAT COMMITTEE BULLHEAD REDUCTION PROJECT 2024 PROJECT SUMMARY

I. COMMITTEE PLANNING

- Planning for the 2024 Bullhead Reduction Project began in April via email messaging with the full committee and individual exchanges with Mike Preul and Greg Matzke.

III. ELECTROSHOCKING ADULT HARVEST RESULTS

- Removed 4,402 adult bullheads which averaged 11.7" and 1.03 pounds per adult
- Preul reported:" bullheads are all big with no small ones spotted by crew"
- Need to continue the annual removal of eggs and fry to keep the population level down

IV. COLLECTION SITE SUMMARY

- Numerous people along with committee members reported that neither eggs nor schools of fry were spotted throughout July.
- Individuals reported finally spotting a low number of schools of fry in mid-August, which was very unusual compared to the three previous years of collection.
- Fourteen individuals put in a total of 26 hours collecting a total of 42 adults, 100,000 120,000 eggs and approximately 1,000 fry which is substantially lower than previous years.
